Free Housing

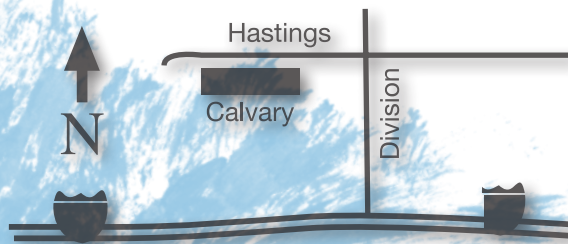
We will seek housing with church families for those requesting it.

Gerry Breshears Grace Community Church of Gresham, Oregon

Gerry Breshears has been professor of theology at Western Seminary since 1980. He served three years with WorldVenture in the Philippines, teaching mathematics at Faith Academy and helping start Calvary Baptist Church. He now teaches overseas about one month per year. In addition to teaching and lecturing at a number of colleges and seminaries

around the world, he speaks in many churches. He is co-author of Vintage Jesus, Death by Love, Vintage Church, and Doctrine with Mark Driscoll in the Re:Lit series from Crossway.

Gerry and his wife, Sherry, have two sons, Donn and David, and a daughter, Cyndee, and three wonderful granddaughters. He is an elder and a member of the preaching team at Grace Community Church of Gresham, Oregon.

Lorenzo Smith Reality LA

Lorenzo was born and raised in British Columbia, Canada. His Christian upbringing was a blessing in many ways but because of it he mistakenly perceived Christianity to be about religious duty and observance. God graciously grabbed his attention at age 21 and it was then that Lorenzo came to understand the Gospel for the first time, and realized that it was all about what Jesus did and not what he had to do. This spiritual awakening ultimately led him to a call to pastoral ministry.



In 1998, Lorenzo played an instrumental role in planting a church in his hometown, and has been involved in formal ministry ever since. Lorenzo spent nine years ministering in Orange County, California, during which time he met his wife, Isabelle. In 2009, God called them to move to Los Angeles where Lorenzo joined the pastoral staff at Reality LA to serve as Executive Pastor.



Worship with Brian Ortize Reality LA

Brian Ortize grew up as a pastor's son in Spokane, Washington. The church shaped everything he did as a kid, but despite knowing all of the Sunday School answers, Brian didn't see his true need for a savior until later in life.

Throughout high school and into his early 20s, Brian played in various bands and spent most of his time and energy trying to obtain rock star status. Though these were "Christian bands," the music became about Brian's glory, not God's. It was during this time of playing music and touring full time that Brian met his wife, Rachel.

Eventually, disillusioned and frustrated with the music scene, Brian gave up music altogether and some time later moved to Los Angeles. It was there that God gave Brian a renewed passion for musical worship and called him into full-time ministry. Brian now recognizes music as a gift from God and a tool to help people worship their Savior.

Brian was eventually made the Music Ministry Pastor at Reality LA and now serves in music and discipleship. Brian, Rachel and their daughter Ellie live in Hollywood.

David Guzik Calvary Chapel of Santa Barbara

For the past seven years, David and his wife, Inga-Lill, have been missionaries to Siegen, Germany, directing the Calvary Chapel Bible College located there. Having finished their work in Germany, David accepted the call to pastor Calvary Chapel Santa Barbara in July 2010.



David has been in pastoral ministry since 1982 and founded Calvary Chapel Simi Valley and served as pastor there for fourteen years. Tim Chaddick Reality LA

Born in the San Francisco Bay area, Tim Chaddick grew up as the son of a pastor. While he was still a boy, his father was plagued by physical difficulties. As his dad's health deteriorated, so did the church, and Tim's involvement in it. Growing up in an extremely irreligious town, Christian faith quickly became the last thing on his mind. During his teen years, playing in several punk bands, he saw music as his savior – the one thing that brought value to his existence.

In 1999, a friend randomly invited Tim to a Christian event and as the preacher related the Gospel, the Holy Spirit touched Tim's heart in such a powerful way that he broke down and wept. He realized the depth of his sin and recognized the glory and power of Christ. After sleeping in the church's gym, he called his bandmates in the morning to tell them that he had met Jesus.

Even though he had enrolled at a Bible college in Southern California, Tim had no intention of pursuing pastoral ministry until a fresh reading of Romans 10 ("How shall they hear without a preacher?") opened his eyes to God's calling on his life.

Tim interned at a large church in Orange County, where he befriended a pastor named Britt Merrick from Santa Barbara County. Greatly moved by Britt's heart and the spirit of his church at Reality Carpinteria, Tim moved with his wife and baby girl to join the staff. A year later, Jesus called Tim and Lindsey to plant a church in Hollywood. The prayer meetings began and in 2006, Reality LA launched.

Tim currently serves as the pastor for preaching and vision at Reality LA. He and his wife Lindsey live in the Silver Lake neighborhood of Los Angeles with their two daughters.
